- Those on Incapacity Benefit can volunteer without affecting their benefit.
- Whichever benefit you receive, you should always inform your benefits agency that you are doing voluntary work.

- Those in full or part-time employment

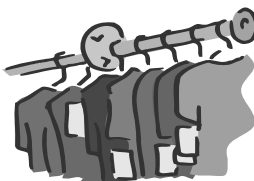
What does Volunteering involve?
