Residual Risk

The residual risk is based on implementation of the control measures above, and the most likely scenario on current known information concerning coronavirus spread. The likelihood of harmful exposure to coronavirus within the shops is considered to be ‘unlikely’ with the above control measures in place. The severity is considered ‘moderate’ as a reasonable average assumption, given the wide range of potential outcomes associated with the virus, and the wide range of other influencing factors. People classified as clinically ‘extremely vulnerable’ or clinically ‘vulnerable’ will have a higher severity level so the risk for them will be higher, although they have their own wellbeing responsibilities under specific Government guidance.
